




<p><b>ST. JOHN'S CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL</b></p>	<p><b>CLASS: Lark Year 5</b></p>	<p><b>TERM: Autumn 1 - 2022</b></p>	
<p><b>ART &amp; DESIGN:</b> Lark class will be focusing on portraits this half term. We will study famous artists, by discussing and evaluating their work and then use this to inform and create our own portraits in their style.</p>	<p><b>ENGLISH:</b> This half term, the children will study a high quality text through our Reading sessions and use this as a basis to inform our writing where we will construct a variety of fiction and non-fiction pieces. We will also explore other literary areas with links to our historical enquiry including: Kennings (poetry derived from the Anglo-Saxon period) and a famous epic - Beowulf.</p>		<p><b>DESIGN &amp; TECHNOLOGY:</b> The children will design and make Anglo Saxon crosses, focussing on intricate details whilst making comparisons and contrasts to other religious crosses.</p>
<p><b>GEOGRAPHY:</b> This half term we will use maps to locate the world's countries, focusing on Europe. We will develop or understanding of key countries involved in the Saxon invasion.</p>	<p><b>MATHS:</b> These are the areas of maths that we will be focussing in this half term. Number - Place Value Number - Addition and Subtraction Number - Multiplication and Division</p>		<p><b>HISTORY:</b> Lark class will learn about: the Scots invasions to north Britain (now Scotland); Anglo Saxon invasions, settlements and kingdoms; important locations and their significance and Anglo-Saxon art and culture.</p>
	<p><b>TOPIC/THEME:</b> Anglo Saxons and Scots</p>		
<p><b>TRIPS/EXPERIENCES:</b> Anglo Saxon Day</p>			
<p><b>LANGUAGES: French</b> The children will consolidate their Year 4 learning to develop fluency and confidence. We will focus on conversational language, including: greetings, numbers, colours and family.</p>	<p><b>SCIENCE:</b> Our unit this term is: 'Properties and Changes of Materials'. - The children will compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. - The children will gain a developed understanding that some materials will dissolve in a liquid to form a solution, and describe how to recover a substance from a solution.</p>		<p><b>MUSIC:</b> This half term the children will learn lyrics and practise singing a variety of harvest-themed songs. They will describe the history and purpose of songs and discuss musical elements.</p>
<p><b>PHYSICAL EDUCATION:</b> Lark class will be developing their knowledge of multi-skills this half term through sessions focusing on team building and outdoor education. Multi-skills involve a variety of movement, thinking and communicating skills which form the foundations of many sports.</p>	<p><b>COMPUTING:</b> The children will be learning about how to use the internet safely and effectively. The children will be using technology to design, share and present their understanding of our history learning. At home and in school, the children will be using TT Rockstars.</p>	<p><b>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:</b> This term, the children will be exploring what Christians believe about God and incarnation. We will also be participating in a church service for the Harvest Festival.</p>	<p><b>PSHE:</b> The children will be participating in a range of activities and discussions to promote well-being. They will develop a clear understanding of British Values and our School Values to enable hope and joy to be shared in the community.</p>
<p><b>HOMEWORK:</b> Daily reading; weekly spelling list; knowledge of multiplication tables and maths work linked to lessons; occasional topic-based research.</p>
