







Friday 10th November – Mandela Class

<p>RE</p> 	<p>Tomorrow, November 11th, is Remembrance Day. On Remembrance Day we remember all those whose lives have been affected by conflict since World War 1. Remembrance Day is an important time and taking part in the acts of Remembrance is a way of showing respect. One way we can take part is by writing and saying a prayer. Can you write a prayer for Remembrance Day? Here is an example of a Remembrance prayer.</p> <p>Dear Lord, Let us live in peace and let wars end. Please let the children not live in a war zone. Let us remember the people who have given up their lives so we can live ours, Amen.</p>
