A homophone is a word that sounds the same but is spelt differently. It also means something different. Can you find any more homophones in your reading book?

REMEMBER
 There are lots of different spelling strategies:

- Sound out the word.
- Break it down into syllables.
- Spell the root word and then add a prefix or suffix.
- Say it in a funny way eg par-li-a-ment.
- Use a mnemonic, eg big elephants can always understand small elephants.
- Look at the word - does it look right?
