**REMEMBER**  
 There are lots of different spelling strategies:

- Sound out the word.
- Break it down into syllables.
- Spell the root word and then add a prefix or suffix.
- Say it in a funny way eg par-li-a-ment.
- Use a mnemonic, eg big elephants can always understand small elephants.
- Look at the word - does it look right?

 Have a go writing the root words by looking them up in a dictionary.

What rule can you make for adding the -ly to these root words ending in -ic or -al?
