What rule do the words above follow? How do you make the root word? Do you just take away the -ly? Why?

REMEMBER
 There are lots of different spelling strategies:

- Sound out the word.
- Break it down into syllables.
- Spell the root word and then add a prefix or suffix.
- Say it in a funny way eg par-li-a-ment.
- Use a mnemonic, eg big elephants can always understand small elephants.
- Look at the word - does it look right?

Try writing out the words again with the root word and the -ly adverb.
 e.g. gentle - gently
